

How to make an eye doctor appointment:

Do you have a vision insurance plan? These plans are bought separately or sometimes provided through your employer

Yes

Call the number on the back of your insurance card to find which eye care provider you can see. Call and schedule an eye exam appointment with them.

Do you know your HMO?

Yes

Please call the number on the back side of your HMO insurance card for a list of covered doctors. Call to schedule an eye exam appointment as soon as you can.

Call BadgerCare Plus Member Services at (800) 362-3002

They may provide you with your HMO's phone number. Call a provider covered under your HMO's plan to schedule an eye exam appointment.

Do you have BadgerCare Plus?

Yes, but I broke my glasses and need a new pair

Call BadgerCare Plus Member Services at (800) 362-3002 to see if they will cover a new pair

Yes, they will

No, they will not

Go to an eye clinic your provider covers to get another pair of glasses. If you are unsure of who your provider covers, call the number on the back of your HMO insurance card and ask for a list of eye clinics you can go to.

No, I do not have any form of insurance

You may be able to apply for Prevent Blindness Wisconsin's voucher program. Please see our Eye Care Voucher Application at wisconsin.preventblindness.org under the resources tab to see if you qualify.

If you qualify, you can receive a free eye exam and a pair of glasses. There will be a list of eye doctors who will accept the voucher. Please make an eye appointment with the eye doctor of your choice.



It is extremely important your child gets a complete eye exam as recommended by their eye doctor. If your child is having vision problems, they need to go see the eye doctor as soon as possible.
