

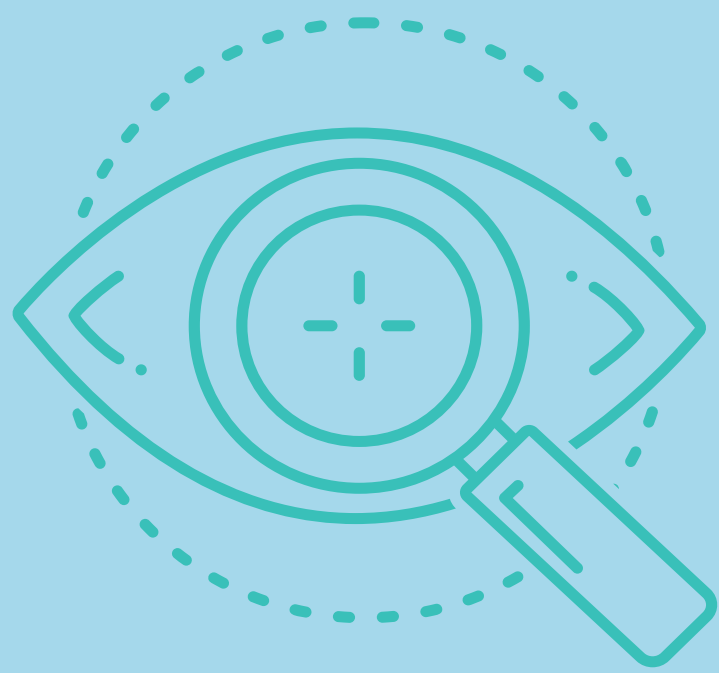


# Prevent Blindness Wisconsin

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## Did you know?

1 in 17 preschool-aged children and 1 in 4 school-aged children has a vision problem



Critical growth and development of a child's eyes is between the ages of **3-5 years old**

of Wisconsin adults aged 40 years and older have some type of visual impairment or eye disease



Correcting vision with glasses increases productivity by more than **20%**, decreases rates of early retirement, and results in safer drivers
