Why Vision Screenings Matter

Vision problems can severely impact a child's ability to learn, read, and fully engage in the classroom. Unfortunately, **Wisconsin is one of only nine states that does not require vision screenings for students**, leaving many children at risk of undiagnosed vision issues.

At Prevent Blindness Wisconsin, we work in close partnership with school nurses, public health departments, and other community organizations to offer vision screenings to as many children as possible. However, some schools simply do not have the resources or capacity to provide screenings themselves.

This is where corporate volunteers step in to make a meaningful difference. By vision screening, your employees help ensure that children who would otherwise go without a screening are given the opportunity to have their vision checked and, if needed, referred for follow-up care. Your participation directly supports equitable access to eye health services and helps students see a clearer, brighter future.



Supporting Healthy Vision for All Children

How it Works

Participating in a vision screening is simple and impactful. Prevent Blindness Wisconsin will work directly with your company to coordinate a meaningful volunteer opportunity that fits your schedule and location. No experience is necessary—just a willingness to help and a desire to make a difference.

- Volunteer Timeframe: Weekdays during the school year (September Early December & Late January May)
- Locations: Typically private choice schools or childcare centers
- Volunteers Needed: 4-8 employees per shift (depending on school size there might be the possibility for 2 shifts)
- Training Provided: All volunteers will receive a short training from PBW staff on site prior to starting the vision screening



Volunteer Responsibilities & Support

Volunteers play an essential role in delivering vision screenings to children who may otherwise go without. All volunteers will be fully prepared and supported before and during their service.

Volunteers will:

- Administer simple vision screening tests (no medical background needed)
- Complete documentation and data collection throughout the screening
- Complete a background check form provided by Prevent Blindness Wisconsin at least one week prior to your scheduled vision screening date

Prevent Blindness Wisconsin will:

- Schedule the vision screening day with the school and provide volunteers with all needed information (location, time, parking information, etc.)
- On-site coordination and supervision
- Provide vision screening supplies and training

 Provide resources to help prepare volunteers prior to the vision screening day


